The nine and Twentieth day of November in the year of our LORD one
Thousand six hundred ninety one I Alexander Culpeper of Dollington in
the County of Kent Esq being in perfect health of body and of sound and
discreet mind memory praised be GOD doe make ordain and constitute
this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following That is to
say first of all I give and bequeath my Soul to GOD that gave it and my
body to the earth from whence it came to be decently buried at the discretion
of my Executors hereinafter named And as touching such worldly goods
wherewith it hath pleased GOD of his infinite goodness to bless me I give
bequeath and dispose of the same in manner and form following That is to
say I give and bequeath all and singular my goods that shall be ready plate
ready money hay and corn in the Barn or on the ground stock utensils of
household or husbandry and personall Estate whatsoever or whereforever
whereof I shall dye possessed or interested in after all my just debts paid
and finally discharged To the right hon^{ble} the Lady Culpeper Baroness
Dowager of Thoresway whom I doe make constitute and ordain and appoint
the sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament And whereas I am seized
to me and my heirs of and in one full sixth part the whole in six parts to be
divided of and in a certain tract of land in the Continent of America called
the Northern neck of Virginia lying betweene Rappahannock and Patomack
rivers in Virginia under and by virtue of a grant thereof formerly made by
his late Majesty King James the second to the right hon^{ble} Thomas Lord
Culpeper and his heirs for ever I doe hereby give and bequeath the said
sixth part of the said tract of land with all and singular the rents issues
and profits advantages and appurtenances whatsoever due accruing or
by any way or means whatsoever arising from or by the same unto the
said right hon^{ble} Margueritt Lady Culpeper Widow and Relict of the said
right hon^{ble} Thomas Lord Culpeper deceased and to her heirs for ever
And I doe hereby revoke annul and make void all and every former and
other Wills by me at any time heretofore made published and declared either
by word or in writing And doe hereby procure publish and declare this
to be my last Will and Testament being all written with my own hand
and sealed the day and yeare first above written Alexander Culpeper Signed
sealed published and by the said Alexander Culpeper declared to be his last
Will and Testament in the presence of Fairfax John Cripps Charles Heydell
Roger Jones.

I John Chaplyn of the parish of S^t Clement^s Sauncs in the County of Midd^x
Vintner and Citizen and Haberdasher of London being sick and weak in body
but of sound and disposing mind and memory and revoking all other Wills
by me made doe make this my last Will and Testament in manner following viz^t
Impris I give and bequeath out of that Estate it hath pleased GOD to give me to my
daughter Dorothy Chaplyn the summe of one hundred and fifty pounds to be paid
her at her age of Twenty one yeares or Twenty dayes after marriage which shall
first happen provided she marrieth with her Mother and my Overseers consent
If without their consent then I give to her onely soe much moneys as in the
discretion of her Mother and my Overseers in way of a portion they shall thinke
fitt and necessary Item I will and bequeath to my Sonne John Chaplyn the summe
of Two hundred pounds to be paid him when he shall attaine to the age of Twenty
one yeares and my studdes watch and gold ring to be kept for him and delivered
to him at the discretion of my Executrix But in case the said Dorothy Chaplyn
shall happen to dye before her marriage or age of Twenty one yeares the said
one hundred and fifty pounds given to her as aforesaid I give and bequeath
to be equally divided between my Executrix and my said Sonne John Chaplyn
And if my said Sonne John Chaplyn shall happen to dye before his attaining
the age of Twenty one yeares then the said Two hundred pounds given to
him as aforesaid I give and bequeath to be equally divided betweene my
Executrix and my daughter Dorothy But in case my said Executrix shall
happen to be married before the death of either of my said two children And
if either of my said children shall happen to dye before their respective
Legacies shall become payable then the part portion and bequest of such
deceased child shall devolve and come to the survivor Item I give to my
Brother George Death my best beaver hatt and wiggs and Ten shillings
to buy him a ring and Ten shillings to my Sister Remington and Ten
shillings to my sister Cooper Item I give to my Brother Thomas Chaplyn
a broad peire of gold not questioning his Brotherly Love and the care he
will take of my Widdow Item I give unto my Brother Ebben Chaplyn one
broad shilling And I doe declare to GOD Almighty and to the world I freely
forgive him all the injuries he hath done me Item I give and bequeath to
my loving friend Abraham Ash a peire of silver pounched called a portett
peere Item I give Twenty shillings to be distributed amongst the poore of the
parish of S^t Clement^s Sauncs aforesaid to those that are not Almshouse people nor
romen beggars at my wifes discretion I desire a modest buriall I give
Gloves to my Relations and those that hold up my pall and what wine the
