wills by me heretofore at any time made and executed
declaring this only to be my last Will and Testament
In witness whereof I the said Benedict Coles have
hereunto set my hand and seal this third day of September
in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven-
hundred and eighty five Benedict Coles (rs) signed sealed
published and declared by the said Benedict Coles the
testator as and for his last Will and Testament in
the presence of us who in his presence and in the o-
presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our
names as witnesses thereof. Samuel Hopkins, William
Heathcote David Miller.

This Will was proved at London the fourteenth day
of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven-
hundred and eighty nine before the worshipful William
Battine Doctor of Laws Surrogate of the Right Worshipful
Sir William Wynne Knight Doctor of Laws Master Keeper
or Commisary of the prerogative Court of Canterbury &
lawfully constituted by the Oaths of John Coles and
Richard Coles the sons of the deceased and two of the
executors named in the said Will to whom Adminon was
granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of
the said deceased having been first sworn duly to Administer
power reserved of making the like grant to Robert Coles
the son also of the said deceased and the other executor
named in the said Will where he shall apply for the same.

This Will was proved at London the second day of
March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred &
eighty nine before the Worshipful William Battine Doctor

do make this my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following (that is to say) I give and bequeath
to my son John Spencer Colepeper my Brilliant Diamond

Ring set in Gold which was the Ring of my Grandfather
 and I hope my son will not take it ill or think it
 is owing to the want of paternal affection in me -
 I do not leave him an inheritance or any other
 provision by this my Will the being sufficiently
 provided for by my marriage settlement with his Mother
 and whereas previous to my marriage with my present
 wife I have and executed a Bond bearing date the
 first Day of April one thousand seven hundred and fifty
 two whereby I became bound unto John Webb of
 Abingdon in the County of Berks Gentleman deceased
 and Edward Grant Clerkwell of Bridgewater Square in
 the parish of Saint Giles Cripplegate London in the
 penalty of two thousand pounds conditioned for the
 payment of One thousand pounds unto my present wife
 in case she should survive me out of my real and
 personal Estates or for the making of such other provision
 for her as therein mentioned And do by this my Will
 confirm the said Bond and all benefit thereof
 which my wife is or may be entitled to under and
 by virtue thereof Also I give and bequeath unto
 my said wife all my real Estates and all my reversions
 Remainders or Reversions of and in any real Estates
 which I may happen to be possessed of interested in
 or entitled unto at the time of my death and all
 my Estate therein to live unto my said wife her
 heirs and assigns for ever And whereas by a certain
 Policy of Insurance No 1009 made by the Society as
 for Equitable Assurances on Lives and Survivorships
 bearing date the nineteenth Day of April last I have
 insured the sum of three hundred pounds upon my own
 life And do by this my Will give and bequeath
 the said Policy of Insurance and the Money thereby
 secured and all benefit and advantage to be made
 thereof or arise therefrom and also all annual &
 other renewals thereof unto my said wife for her own
 proper use and benefit And do also give and
 bequeath unto my said wife all my and mine
 of any nature which shall be possessed of or which
 shall be in my hands coming to me at the time of my
 decease and also my Coach and horses and all my
 Jewels Plate and all my China Silver
 and Linnen and all my household goods and furniture
 of what nature or kind soever and also all my
 Library of Books together with my Globes Telescopes
 Microscopes and all other my Mathematical Instruments
 and all other my personal Estate of what nature or
 kind soever which I shall be possessed of interested
 in or entitled unto at the time of my decease to
 hold unto my said wife for her own proper use and
 benefit And it is my desire and I request the favor

of my sole of London in the County ^{of Middlesex} or such of his family as may survive him to permit me to be buried in the parish church there as near as may be to the body of my late very dear and amiable son Robert Spenser Colpeper and I wish and heartily recommend it to my wife to direct that she be also interred with us but my express will herein is that I be carried down with as little charge as possible and interred in the most private manner I have thus put my whole confidence in my wife upon a full conviction of her goodness and that she will supply my care of our dear only daughter Mary and to whom under Gods good providence I ^{solely} commit the care not thinking it advisable to make any division of property between them or to make her in any way independant of our brother and I do hereby nominate and appoint my said present wife sole executrix of this my last will and Testament and revoking all former wills declare this only to be my last will and Testament in witness whereof I the said John Spenser Colpeper have to this my last will and Testament consisting of two sheets of paper set my hand and seal that is to say to the first sheet thereof I have set my hand only and to the second sheet my hand and seal this twenty eighth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight J. S. Colpeper signed sealed published and attested by the said Testator John Spenser Colpeper as and for his last will and Testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses hereto R. Marshall J. A. Jefferson J. A. Pleator

On the 13th July 1798 James with the will annexed of the goods of the said John Spenser Colpeper formerly of Churchhouse Square in the County of Middlesex but late of Boulogne in the Kingdom of France deceased left standing by which Colpeper widow deceased left having the said sole executrix and residuary legatee named in the said will was granted to Mary Colpeper Spinster the daughter and heiress of the goods of the said John Spenser Colpeper widow deceased - She having been first sworn duly to perform

This Will was proved at London the fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine before the Right worshipful Sir William Wynne Knight Doctor of Laws Attorney at Law or Commissioner of the Prerogative Courts of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the oath of Mary Colpeper widow the executrix of the deceased and sole executrix named in the said will to whom Administration was granted of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased having been first sworn duly to Administer
