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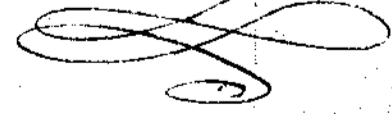

 be given to allmyghtie god throughe his in boddie yet of godd holles and perfect remembrance knowing  
 my selfe to be as all men be mortall and naturallie borne to die and that no man knowith why he  
 wher it shall please allmyghtie god to call hym from this transitorie liue and mynding throughe his  
 mercie and goodnes before my departure oute of the same to declare my laste mynde will and testamnt  
 aswell of all my Landes and tenementes within the realme of Englonde as also of all my goodes and  
 Chattells what so ever they be not onlie for the aduoyding of such contention as myght otherwise  
 growe after my decess but also for the better aduancement contentation and quietnes of my wife

have dwelled with me by a yere as well men as women shall have one yere waye and one  
monthes lorde over and besides the wayes to them owinge at the tyme of my decess Item I will  
and my full mynde and intent is that everie one of my retyned shall have twentie shillings  
and a black Coate Item I will and beqte to my Cooke and to Edward Everard to either of  
them twentie shillings Item I will and beqte of the Surplusage of all my gooddes and  
Cattells my debtes Legacies and furralls beinge discharged I will give and beqte the one half  
unto my saide wyf and the otter half to be evenly divided betwene Bynde Calthropp Anne  
Culpeper my Brother Jasperes daughter George Banney and Edmond Brampton And I doo  
constitute ordaine and make Sir Thomas Woodhousse knyghte and my saide wyf my  
Excutours And I give unto Sir Thomas Woodhousse as a Remembrance and token of my good  
will and in parte of a recompense for his payng my regalls now comyng in his custodie  
a pance of ectordeed and fyve markes in money Item I give will and beqte unto my Cousin  
Lathreine Bynde thre poundes fyve shillings and eight pence of currant monney of Englonde  
Item I will give and beqte to my Cousin Thomas Culpeper of Balam in Suffe thre  
poundes fyve shillings eight pence and a gelding Item I will and beqte to my sister Corbett  
my Cousin Dacie and to my Cousen Elizabeth mine to everie of them a ringe worth twentie  
shillings Item I will and beqte to M<sup>rs</sup> Blomefelde and to M<sup>rs</sup> Geyne to either of them  
a ringe worth twentie shillings Item I will give and beqte to M<sup>rs</sup> Doree Jayne M<sup>rs</sup> Geyne  
and to Marie Nowton to everie of them fourtie shillings of currant monney of Englonde Item

I give and bequeathe to person Geene twentye shillinges of curant money of Englonde/ Provided allwaie  
and my full mynde and intent is that wher I the saide John Culpeper wryteth out the assent of my  
saide wif haue made terten Leasses for terme of terten yeres yet enduering of the maner of Eluisted  
withe the appurtenances witym the countie of Kent beinge the yoynture of my saide wif that my  
saide wif witym one moneth next after my decess shall be com bounden vnto my saide Cousen Goune  
Paynell in the sum of one hundred markes indorsed witye condition that the my saide wif shall  
suffer the saide Leasses peacable and quietlie to occupie holde and enjoye the saide Leasses for  
and duringe theire yeres mentioned in the saide Leasses or elles all and euery Leganc and bequest  
by me giuen to my saide wif by this my testament and last will to be utterly frustrate and  
void any thynge before mentioned notwithstanding

Watehurst in the Countie of Suffes of quene my brother to haue and to holde the saide Maner  
and other the pmisses witye the appurtenances vnto the saide John Culpeper and to his heires  
for ever vppon such condition as hereafter followeth that is to saye that the saide John Culpeper  
my brother his heires or Assignes doo paye or cause to be payed vnto myne Excutours the sum  
of three hundred and twentye poundes of Lawfull money of Inglonde in maner and forme following  
for and towards the performanc of this my last will and testament that is to saye witym one  
quarter of a yere next after my decess eight score poundes and witym one yere and three quarters  
of a yere then next followinge other eight score poundes in full contentacion and payment of  
the saide three hundred and twentye poundes And if the saide John Culpeper my brother or his  
heires shall make any defaulte in the payment of the saide summe of three hundred and twentye  
poundes as ys aforesaide Then I will that the saide maner and other the pmisses witye the appurtenances  
be solde by myne Excutours and the money therof to be by them imployed and bestowed  
for and towards the performanc of this my sayde will and testament And I will that one Sir Thome  
Kemp Knight shall haue the profertment therof yowinge therfore as any other man will vnde for the  
saide Item I will the seven acres of Lande be it more or lesse whiche I late purchard of one John  
Gibbes lying in Inggham and staligam vnto one Elizabeth Smythe and to her heires And wherof
