I, Thomas Colepeper Baronet of Preston Hall in the parish of
 Dylesford in the County of Kent being in perfect health and sound
 memory do make this my last will and Testament revoking all former
 Wills and Codicils first I recommend my soul to that great and almighty
 God that gave it me in whom I hope to find mercy and forgiveness
 for all my sins my body I bequeath to the ground to be decently and
 privately buried in the same grave with my wife and her daughter
 under my servants house in the parish Church of Dylesford in the County
 of Kent. I do give to Sir Thomas Taylor Baronet the son of my sister
 the Lady Taylor of the park near Aldershot in Kent all my Estate
 in Dylesford and shewere to him and his heirs lawfully begotten
 provided he pay my outt debts as he will easily find to be made re-
 appear and give outt elegatice as I shall hereafter mention. I give to
 the Lady Taylor Twenty pounds to buy her mourning and rub her off
 of all pretensions to my Estate I give to Robin Colepeper Gentleman one
 shilling to rub him off of all pretensions and I give to the Lady Twisden
 of St. Edmunds now Sir Thomas Twisden wife the sum of five hundred
 pounds and is due. I waive that her woman for her faithful
 service to her I therefore give unto her one hundred pounds and ten
 pounds a year the proportion to be paid quarterly during her life and
 ten pounds to buy her mourning all the rest of my servants I give that
 are with me at my death a years wages except the waggoner and his
 mate I give to the Mr. Riders each of them at Boughton ten shillings the
 Elder and younger Brother ten pounds a peice to buy them mourning
 and I make the above said Sir Thomas Taylor Baronet sole Executor
 to this my last will In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal this sixteenth day of February 1727. Tho. Colepeper. Signed
 and sealed published and declared this to be my last will and Testament
 in the presence of Barab. Rider. Just. Champreio. Ric. Colvill.

this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following—
first I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave

blessed Saviour and Redeemer to obtaine the free pardon and forgiveness
of all my sins and my body I commit to the Earth and desire to be
interred in Buriall fields in such decent manner as my Executors
hereinafter named shall thinke fit and as touching such worldly
estate God of his goodness and mercy hath blessed me withall I give
devise and dispose thereof in manner and form following And
whereas by virtue of the Intermariage of my now wife I became
lawfully entitled to the remainder of a certain term of years of and in
the several messuages and buildings situate and being in or
near Vinces Court or yard in the said parish of St. Leonard
Morethill together with all and every the appurtenances thereto
belonging or appertaining purchased by lease by her former husband
of Benjamin Betton and whereas there have been since erected two
other messuages on the said premises and I have lately purchased
the free simple and full inheritance thereof I give devise and bequeath
the said several messuages and premises together with all and
every the rights members and appurtenances thereto belonging
or appertaining unto my dearly beloved wife Sarah Crompton
and to her heirs and assignes forever them and as touching
and concerning my personall estate consisting of goods made and
unmade in Trade together withall and every the utensils thereto
belonging and likewise all my plate household goods of what Nature
quantity or quality so ever and all Debts due and owing to me at the
time of my decease I give devise and bequeath the same unto my
dearly beloved wife Sarah Crompton her Executors Administrators
or Assignes and all the rest and residue of my estate not hereby
before disposed of I give devise and bequeath the same unto the said
Sarah Crompton my dearly beloved wife whom I do make ordaine
constitute and appoint to be the whole and sole Executrix of this my
last Will and Testament and I do hereby revoke make null and
void all Will and Wills by me heretofore made and do publish
and declare ratifye and confirm this Writing being writ on one
sheet of paper to be as and for my only last Will and Testament
